Our Next Areas Of Focus

Moving Forward

Y7s: Now they have settled in, Year 7s can start to think about their whole-year residential trip to PGL.

Y8s: Have the "Future Me" workshop in early March with University of East Anglia.

Y9s: Next term Year 9's focus will be on their GCSE and BTEC options with parents evening and discussions with teachers and careers experts.

Y10s: Having completed 20% of their GCSE and BTEC courses, the Y10 are now focusing on making sure they have the best quality notes and foundation knowledge for their final exams next year. They know they won't cover this content again! Year 10 have started planning their work experience for the summer.

Y11s: Have started the run-in to the final exams in May and June. They are making the most of the learning opportunities from the mock (practice) exams so that they can peak at the right time, just like athletes getting ready for the Olympics. We are training them in techniques and how to "think like a gold medalist". Keep an eye out for lots more revision materials and exam advice next term. They will also have a practice interview day – when local employers will be in school to give the Y11s experience of job and college interviews.

Y6 Taster Days: A series of exciting after school sessions designed to give year 6 a glimpse into the engaging and inspiring activities they can look forward to as part of our school community.

Musicals: After the brilliant Shrek the Musical; get ready to enjoy not only one but <u>two</u> musicals. Rehearsals are underway for Moana and Sweeney Todd.
